

Classroom Activities

I am a Superhero

Items needed:

Coloring pages (included in this packet)
Crayons

Provide each child with a coloring page. Each student should come up with a reason why he or she is a superhero and fill in the blank. The kids can personalize their own superhero drawings by drawing in the face and coloring in the hair and clothes.

Superhero Collage

Items needed:

Magazines and newspapers
Child-friendly scissors
Glue
Large roll of white paper

Provide students with magazines and newspapers. Ask each student to find one image of someone being a superhero. The superhero should be demonstrating kindness, recycling or helping an animal. Each child can cut out the superhero image and present it to the class. After the children present their superhero images, they can glue the images to a large banner of white paper to make a Superhero Collage.


Superhero Badges

Items needed:

Construction paper
Markers
Cape


Have each student create a kindness badge using construction paper and markers. Kids can give their badges to another child who they observe being a superhero. At the end of the week, recognize the child who received the most kindness badges. Provide the child with a superhero cape to wear for the day. Continue with this activity each week to consistently encourage children to make small changes in their actions that make a big difference.
